


About the Author:




About the Illustrator:










Finally, the nine months had come and gone, and Iris' belly had grown. Soon the family would be able to take their own little fleur de lis home!






Lily couldn't believe it! Today was the day. Finally, it was her baby brother she'd get to meet. She couldn't wait to hold him and put a kiss on his cheek.

















"Fleur Delivery" Facts

Fleur De Lis

In French, it means, "Flower Lily", or "Flower of the Lily." Signifies perfection, light and life. Represents French royalty. Was adopted and worn by many kings dating back from 493 A.D. It's seen widely in different versions of an Iris flower. Has been a visual symbol of New Orleans and it's recovery.

All surrounding Louisiana parishes hold the symbol close to their hearts.

In July, 2008, following Hurricane Katrina, it was officially made the symbol of the state of Louisiana.

King Clovis

King of France in 493 A.D. He put a flower in his helmet just before his victory at the Battle of Vouille', which lead him to choose the Fleur De Lis and consistently use it as his royal symbol.

Flower "Bud"

From which a flower or flowers develop. What you see first, before a flower grows.

Rose

Type of flower: woody perennial. Colors range from white, yellows, pinks and reds. Pronounced rose' (ro-say) in French

Petit

French adjective meaning "small" or "little"
